

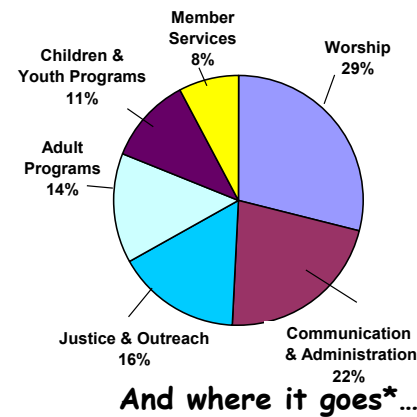
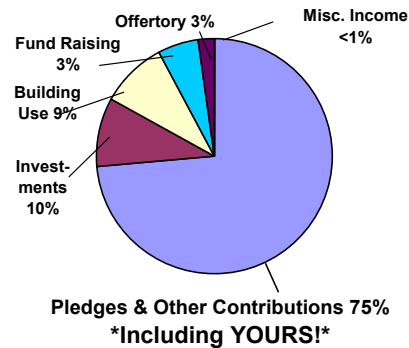
Why pledge?

Calculating Your 5% Commitment

1. Determine your annual gross household income.
2. Move the decimal to the left one place.
3. Divide that number by 2.

Example:

1. Income = \$42,000
2. \$4,200
3. Divide \$4,200 by 2 -- & Annual commitment = \$2,100 or \$175 per month.

Growing Stronger Together

Even while we are unable to gather in the church building, UUCMP is a strong and vital part of the lives of those in the congregation and is an active presence in the larger community. We have **grown stronger together!**

- We *grow stronger together* by volunteering and serving and by carrying out routine tasks critical for smooth, regular operations and activities.
- We *encourage growth and development* with our financial support of church programs. We donate as we are able, giving “until it feels right and good” with 5% of income as goal.



We recognize that a church, like a family, must have a stable base of support for security. So, most of us **pledge** each year. Our pledges and gifts make up over 75% of UUCMP’s income. Pledges allow the Board to make practical plans for the next fiscal year, and to approve a realistic budget to pay for these plans.

Whether you already give, decide to give for the first time, or begin the process of moving toward a higher category of giving over the next few years, we encourage everyone to give *meaningfully*.

Your pledge does not simply support our budget and financial stability; it is a moral commitment to our leaders and community. We celebrate everyone’s giving!

What is a Pledge?

A pledge is your commitment to UUCMP of the amount you will contribute during our 2021-22 fiscal year, beginning July 1, 2021.

When do I pay my pledge?

Any time before the end of the fiscal year, June 30, 2022. Some pay monthly, some all at once; you can choose your schedule. Early and steady payments are best.

How do I pay my pledge?

You can mail a check to the church office, or you can submit your pledge on the church website by clicking on the “donate” button. Some people include a payment when they return their pledge cards.

Can I pay my pledge with a stock donation?

Yes. Call the office or email admin@uucmp.org for assistance. If your stock has appreciated since you acquired it, you may get the double benefit of no capital gains tax plus a charitable deduction on the full value. And those over age 70-1/2 may make gifts from retirement accounts, too, avoiding taxes.
